(N = 17)

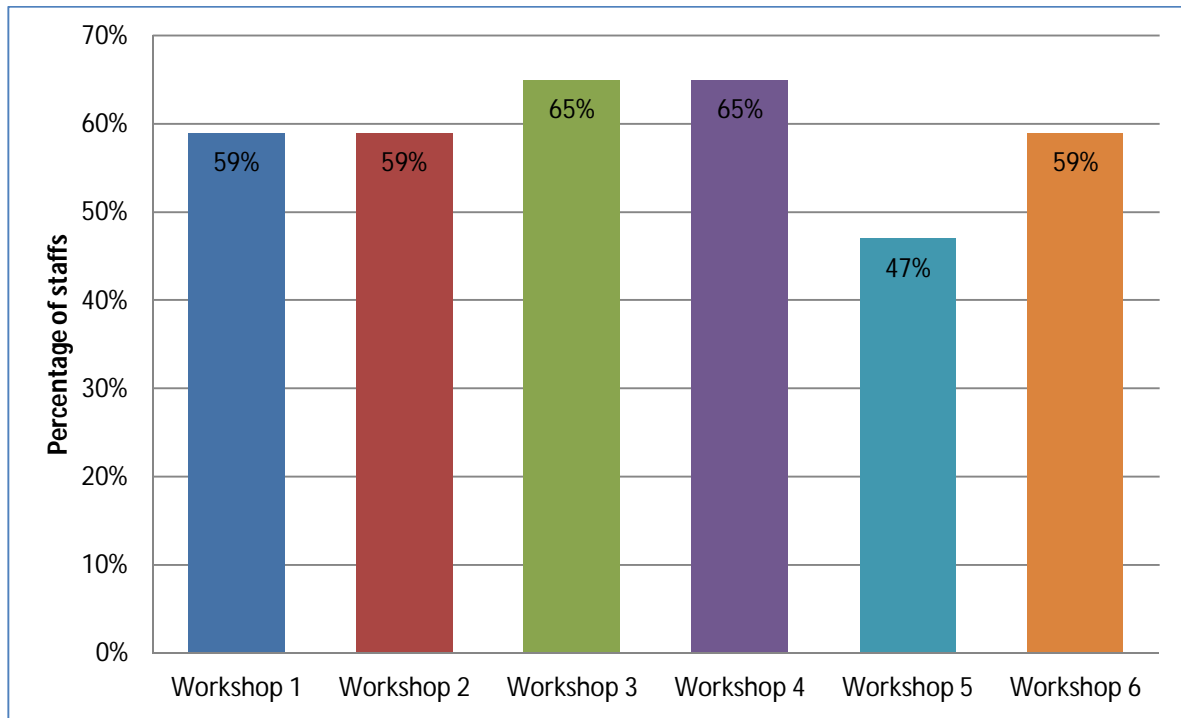


Figure 1 shows, among the six workshops, majority of staff (65%) attended workshop three and four, while only 47% participated in fifth workshop. In comparison with these, other workshops maintained an equal attendance 59%.

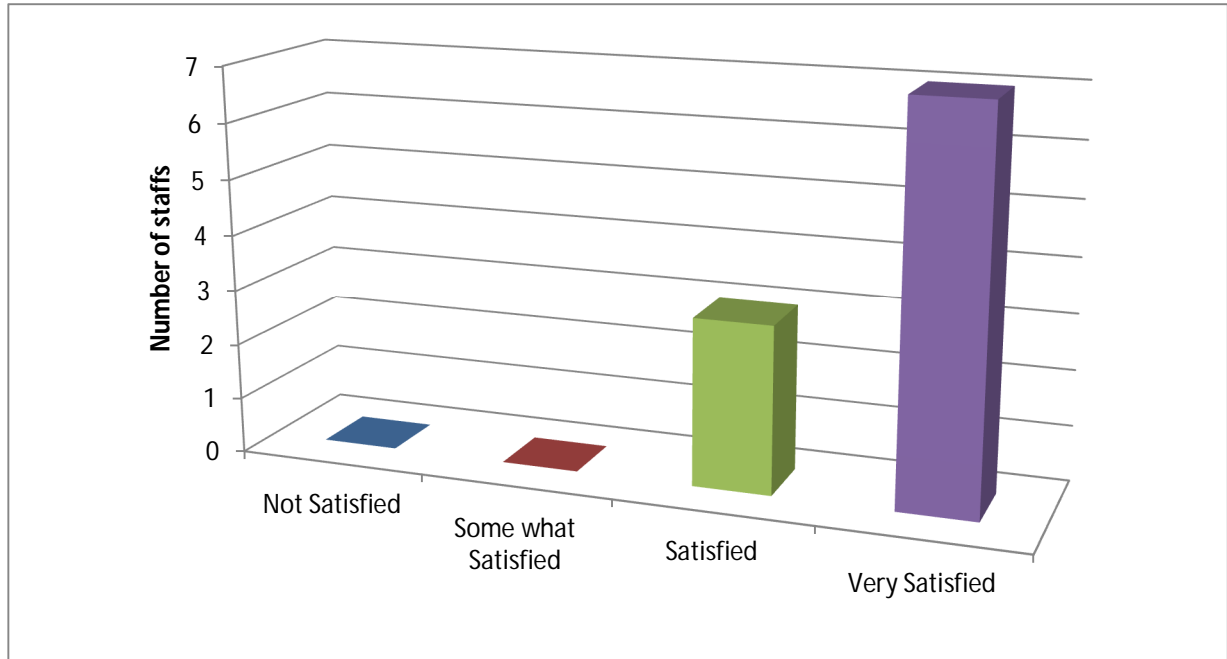


FIGURE 3: LEVEL OF SATISFACTION OF STAFFS ATTENEDED WORKSHOP 2

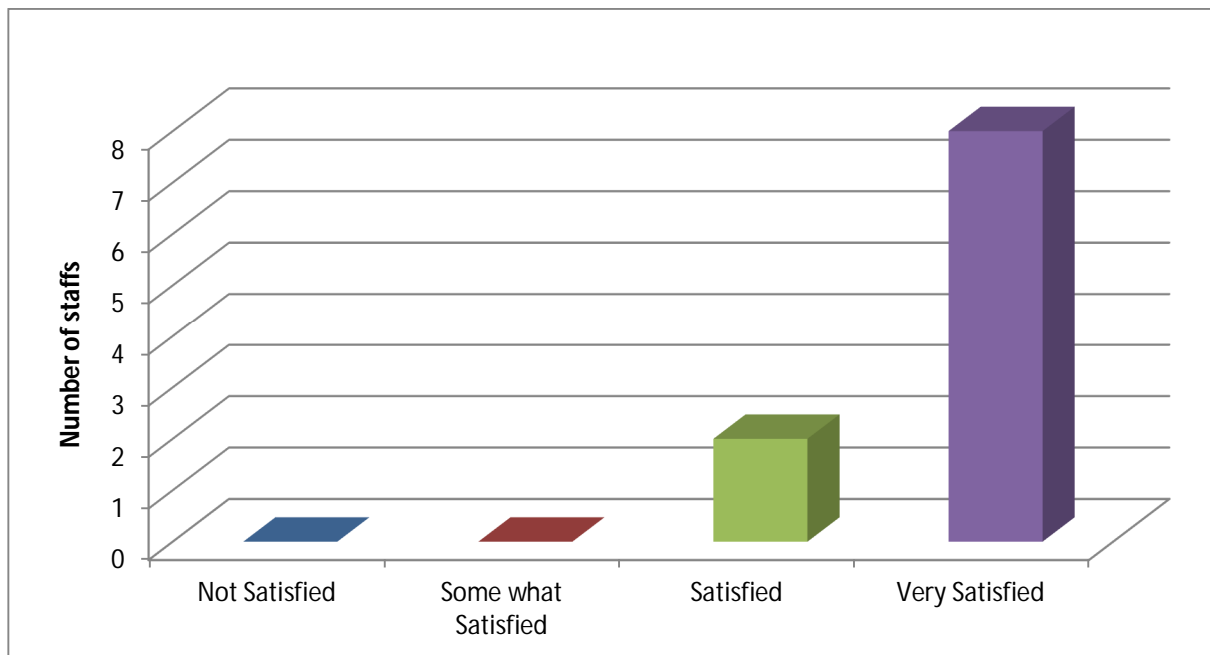


FIGURE 4: LEVEL OF SATISFACTION OF STAFFS ATTENEDED WORKSHOP 3

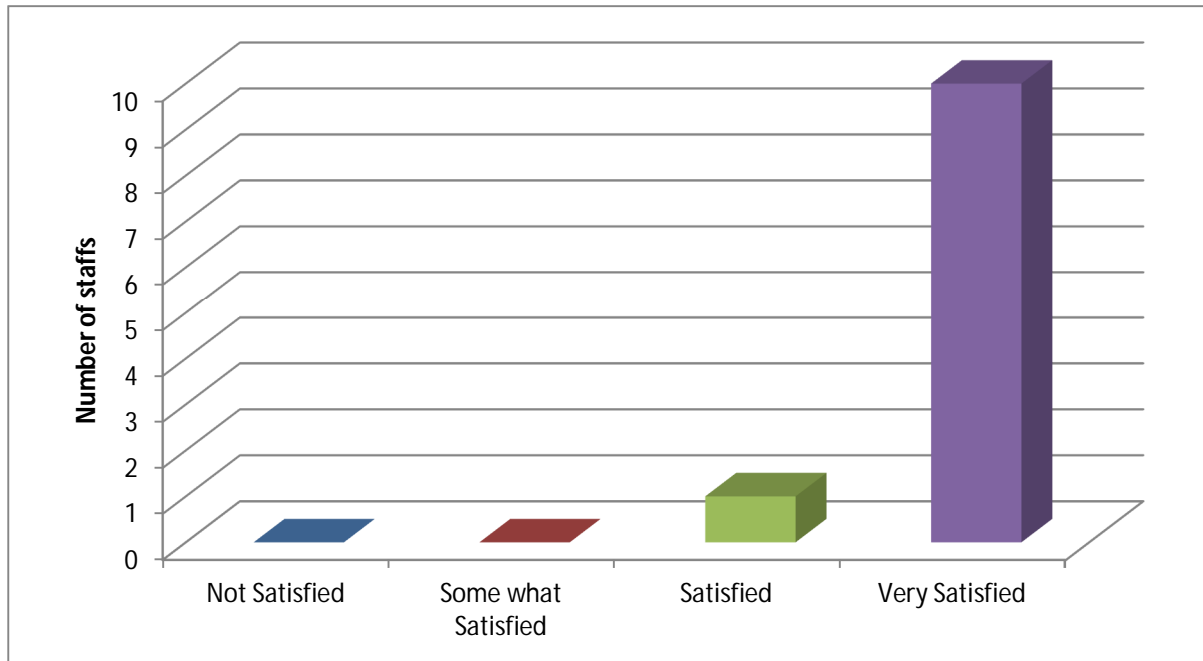
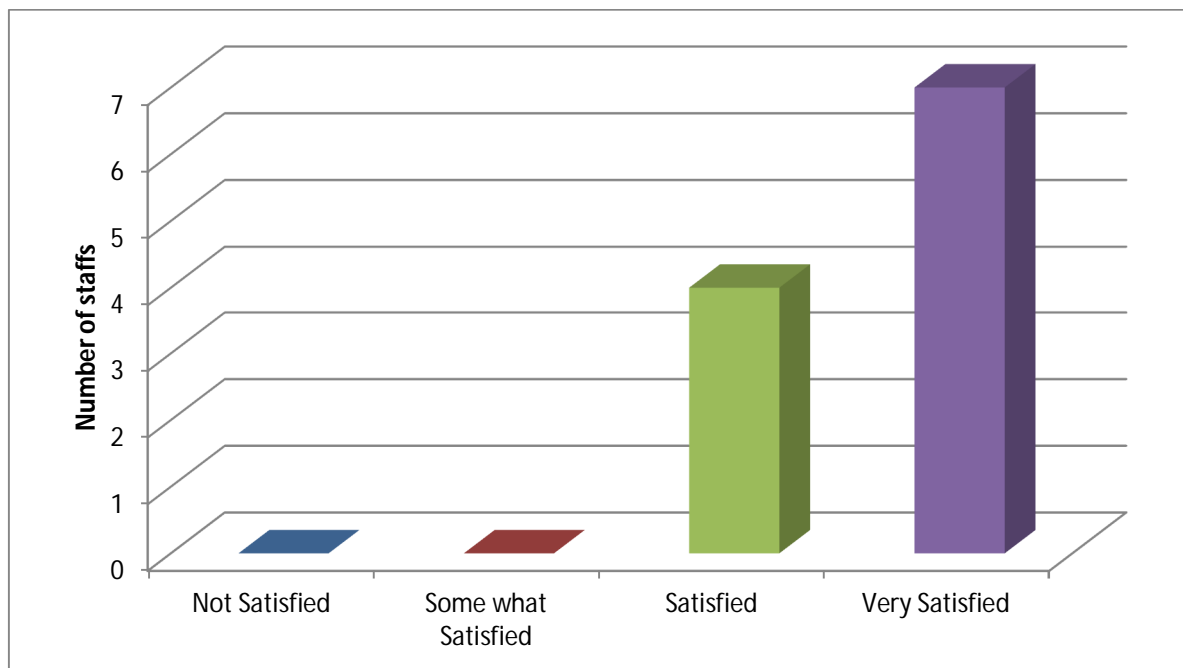


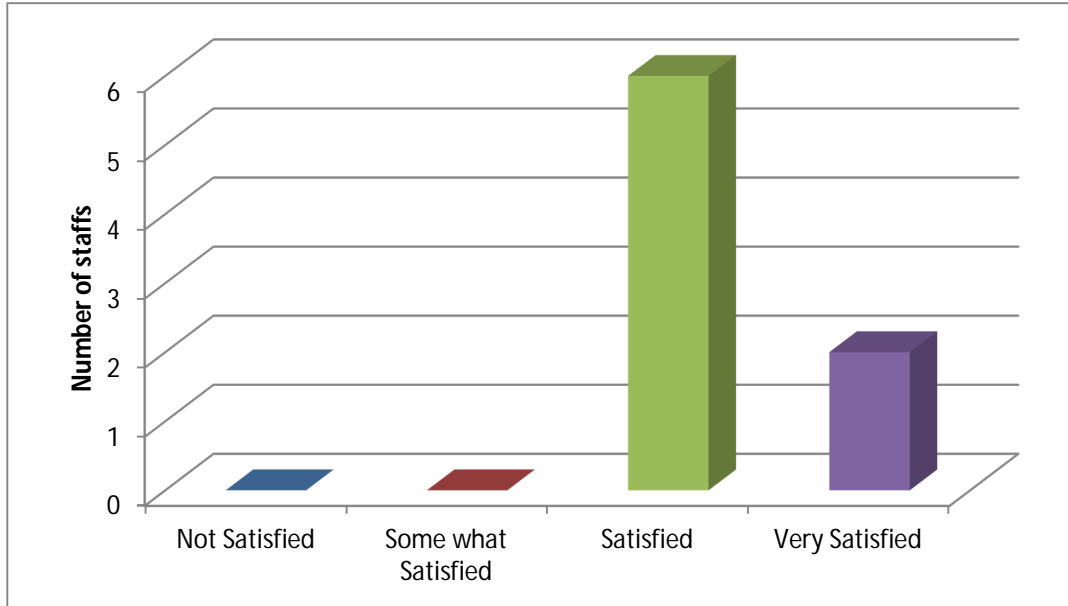
FIGURE 5: LEVEL OF SATISFACTION OF STAFFS ATTENEDED WORKSHOP 4

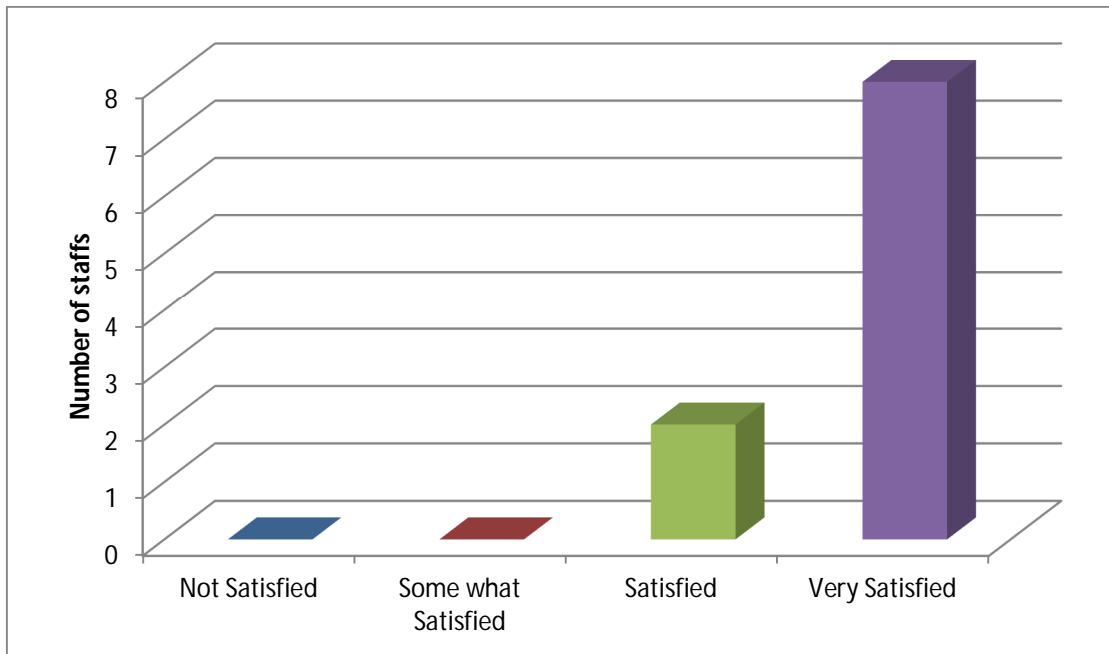

Among the six workshop conducted, none of the staffs were in the category of not satisfied and somewhat satisfied. 91% of staffs felt very satisfied with 3rd workshop while only 25% very satisfied with 5th workshop.
